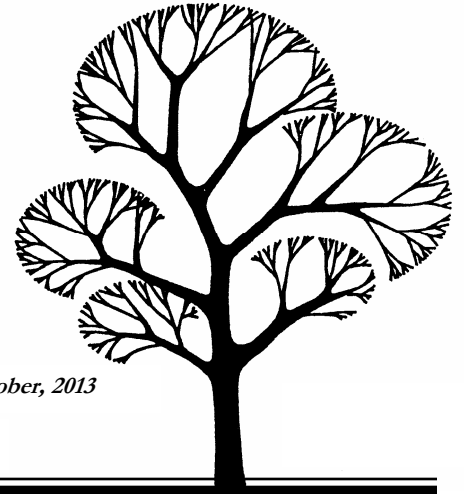

President's Message

I would like to share a few random thoughts.

First, I was very excited to hear that Terry Young, a descendant of Joseph Taylor (1751-1819), has purchased the land on the back side of his property from Banks Crandall. This adds more of the original Taylor property and the Taylor Cemetery under his management. Terry and Linda, his wife, are wonderful people and have a great sense of family legacy. Terry was responsible for getting the road improvements and access to the Taylor Cemetery complete a year ago. Read more in this Taylor Times.

You are aware that the Taylor Family Association (TFA) uses Legacy Family Tree (LFT) genealogy software <http://www.legacyfamilytree.com> to maintain our files. If you are using the software as well, I hope you are taking advantage of the free webinars offered by LFT on Wednesdays. All webinars are free for a week after the presentation, so you can listen on your computer at your own time. The webinars about LFT are ALL free, while guest presentations cost to hear or purchase on CD after the week. Geoff Rasmussen does the webinars on LFT. I highly recommend his recent webinar on “*Digital Research Guidance, Research Log and To Do Lists: Family Search, Research Wiki, and Legacy Family Tree.*” This webinar discusses the powerful features in LFT to help you in your research and documentation for each family member. Each research suggestion is based on the information YOU have in the file on that person. POWERFUL.


Jeff has also done several webinars on managing your family history pictures which I highly recommend as well. You can find the archive of LFT webinars at http://www.familytreewebinars.com/archived_webinars.php. You can buy a subscription for a month or year but you can see them all and view the LFT free ones at any time.

Speaking of pictures. I recently took a trip to Calgary, Alberta, Canada to visit friends. While there the cousins of my

grandmother Mary Maud Harding Taylor, (her sister Alice Harding and Austin Bennett) held a reunion hosted by Richard and Kristi Bennett and had me speak about family associations. (There are over 1000 descendants of this family in Alberta.) At the reunion Myrana Worthington showed me an original picture of the Maud and Lorenzo Taylor family that Maud had sent to Alice. I had a photocopy, but Myrana gave me the original picture! I scanned it in high resolution as a .tiff file and also as a .jpeg file for email. I have added it to my Lorenzo Taylor slice for the TFA family file, posted it in the LDS Family Search Family Tree and I emailed it to the 300 descendants of Lorenzo and Maud. It was interesting to get the comments back from the emailed photo. The younger generation responded with comments and one even requested the .tiff file and fixed the background of the picture. I plan to add the picture to the TFA online library when I have established the approximate date it was taken with other family members.

You can add photos of family and family events to our online library as well. Just send the scanned picture to our webmaster, Karl Taylor at karl@taylorassociation.org. Please include a caption, the names of the persons in the photo and date are great. These photos are in our public side of the website and are free to use by family members to share with their children. You can also send copies of documents and pictures of family artifacts that you would like to share with family members.

We will be having Google “Hangouts” for training and information again this season, so watch your email and participate or view.

Keep in touch with your family and gather those family picture and stories.

Good things we've accomplished:

- **Our Taylor reunions.** Before we got ourselves organized we had large reunions only about once a generation.
- **Our newsletter.** No, we don't have twenty volumes yet. In our early days we didn't always have enough news to finish a volume each year. Thanks to the Internet and email, we now have so much news we can't print it all. We do try to cover the milestones of our lives when they are shared with us and tell you a bit about any new research findings. Many thanks to all of you who have contributed.
- **Our website.** We're still trying to upload everything we've got, but there's a lot up there already. See it at <http://www.taylorassociation.org>. It contains an extensive and growing collection of biographies and a number of research reports and source documents.
- **Our Facebook page,** for our social media fans.
- **Our Google hangouts.** Training and planning sessions.
- **Our Taylor y-DNA study,** organized by Ron & Noel Taylor. We have proof we're connected to Joseph Taylor Jr. and his wife Sarah Best and not just climbing the wrong Taylor tree. We're close to proving the generation before that. We've gained strong hints that tie us to a possible immigrant ancestor and a family in London.
- **Our London research.** Taylor funds paid for Phil Dunn's work.
- **Funds to help organize research** done by Gayle Hix and his helpers with the Adopt-a-County Project.
- **Help with the care and maintenance of the Taylor Cemetery** near Richardsville, in Warren County, Kentucky.
- **A Legacy Family Tree Webinar,** held at our 2012 Salt Lake Conference and watched online by hundreds of people in the U.S. and foreign countries.



Good things we can't take credit for:

- **Nearly 200 years of family records** recorded and saved by Taylor family members. Notable among these efforts were those collected by Pleasant Green Taylor when he visited his Kentucky cousins while on an LDS mission about 140 years ago. Also Taylor Family bible records. We have been excited to have several "new" members join us this year from lines that haven't been represented before.
- **Earlier Taylor organizations,** starting with the Kentucky Reunion in 1909.
- **William Thorndale's research,** paid for the Pleasant Green Taylor family.
- **The Taylor family history books** compiled by Shari Franke and her husband Don. She has just "finished" the research needed for Volume 3 of the second edition. Volumes 1 & 2 have been published and all three volumes are more than twice the size of the first edition, offered at the 1993 reunion. Shari also created the core of the Taylor Descendants database used by our association.
- **Research in and around Nauvoo,** performed by Ken Crossley. Also the James Calvin Taylor family's monument to William Taylor.
- **Collateral line histories,** such as Allreds, Lakes, etc. We try to publicize their efforts and we are trying to increase the collaboration between us.
- **The Promised Land pageant,** an annual pageant held each summer in North Carolina, written and directed by Judy Downey, based on the story of Joseph Taylor Jr. & the Revolutionary War.
- **Joseph Taylor monuments in two cemeteries** in Warren County, Kentucky.



Good things we hope for and plan for the future:

- **Further research on earliest known Taylors.** Additional records appear on the web daily for Taylor & collateral lines. We would also like to hire additional help where professional help is indicated.



- **A public database on our website**, with source citations, but not including living persons. This would help Internet browsers decide whether our Taylor family is their Taylor family.
- **A project to add sources to FamilySearch Family Tree**, with discussions and links to our website. This would help our cousins find our organization and decide which individuals on the FamilySearch tree really have correct data.
- **Ongoing improvements and maintenance** for our Taylor Cemetery in Kentucky.
- **Roadshow reunions**, in places where Taylor descendants are clustered. Possible sites might be Southern Utah, Arizona, Idaho, Illinois, Kentucky, and Tennessee.
- **Tour guides**, possibly multimedia. For armchair travelers and vacationers who would like to have directions to nearby Taylor landmarks. We also need GPS coordinates.
- **Better ways to keep in touch** with members we lose track of, because of moves, deaths, etc.
- **A “new member packet”** a welcome and get-started guide.
- **Scanning** of the binders from the Adopt-a-County project and other research by Gayle Hix.
- **More volunteers to help** with all Taylor family branches, to keep up with the rising generation. Ron Taylor has assembled a database of nearly record-breaking size. We need volunteers with technical skills and people skills, but you don't need to have both. Our best estimate is that we have collected about 75% of the Taylor family names up to the year 1900, 50% of the Taylor descendants between 1900 and 1950, but only 20% of Taylors from 1950 to the present. We have much work to do! There is work for everyone, no matter what their skills are.
- **More training for our volunteers.** More Google hangouts and perhaps a set of instructional videos.



We welcome your ideas. What good things would you like to see us plan for in the *next* twenty years?



Back Issues of the Taylor Times

If you want more details about the Taylor Family Association's doings in the last twenty years, you'll need to browse our old newsletters. Where are they?

The oldest ones are on a big .pdf file on a CD if you ordered one a few years back. The newer ones are online individually, but you must log in with your password to get to them. (Contact Laura Winder—see p. 10—if you need a password.) Your editor is planning to split the old .pdf file into individual issues and post them online, hopefully as this issue is going to press.

There are several useful ways to look at these files: browse and read the articles, refer to an article we've cited in a current issue (rather than reprinting it), or do an every-word search with Adobe Reader for the names of people in your family line. For some purposes, individual files work best; for others you can save time by searching through a large file. Our plan is to give you a choice.

One caution: We've reported a lot of ideas and theories about Taylor origins in the past that we aren't so sure of today. There's a lot of trial and error in genealogy research. Read our early articles with that in mind. We have sometimes printed corrections in a following issue, but not always. We don't even know about some of our errors yet. If you'd like to see a correction to something in our old newsletters, please email eileen.phelps@littlehillsservices.net and we will start a column listing these corrections and suggestions. We can't promise to correct the earliest originals, however. Bringing them into Photoshop causes the text to blur and into Publisher causes the spacing to change. Some of Adobe Acrobat's editing capabilities no longer work, probably because of Windows updates.

If you don't see the complete set of back issues online by the time you get this newsletter, check back in a couple of weeks. We have to give our webmaster time to put them out. He's got a lot on his plate.

James Wesley Taylor, Union Soldier

James was born 22 Sep 1824 near Richardsville, in Warren County, Kentucky, to Joseph Best Taylor and Polly Ann Hudnall, making him a grandson to Joseph Taylor Jr. and Sarah Best. He married Marcia Ann “Mary” Floyd 26 Jan 1846 and they had 10 children, according to our records, eight of whom were boys.

James turned 37 in 1861, the year the Civil War started. He and older brother Thomas and younger brother Joseph all enlisted in the Union Army. Thomas was killed, and James was a prisoner of war in Libby Prison, Richmond, Virginia, and later in the infamous Andersonville Prison in Georgia. He must have been a robust individual. He outlasted his wife Mary, who died in 1872, and later married Louisa Ellen Whalin and they had eight more children, five daughters and three sons! When James died in 1901 at the age of 77, Louisa was entitled to a pension. She was then a few days short of 53, and her youngest was not yet 10.

Thanks to recent indexing by FamilySearch volunteers and acquisitions by Fold3.com, we have been able to add additional details to James’ Civil War experiences. We plan to begin uploading Carol’s growing collection of digital photos of James and some of his family members to our Taylor website, along with the images from Fold3 during the month of November.

Here is the story we have found so far:
James enrolled 15 Sep 1861 as “1 Sgt” in Capt. Phelps’ Company G, in the 11th Regiment of Kentucky Volunteers at Camp Caloway,^[sic] Ohio County, Kentucky for a term of two years. In 9 Dec 1861 he is in “Calhoun McLean Co., Ky.” Muster cards show him as “Present” for this time. In 31 Dec 1861 he was paid \$20. (This may not be all he received in this period.) He is listed through June as being present.

In the muster of 18 Aug 1862, he is described as absent “On detached duty.” Place and duty are not given on the card. On another muster card he is described as “Present” April 30 to Aug 31. Odd, but indicating that they knew where he was. From here through Oct 1863 he is also present, according to the cards.

James is “missing in action at Lenoir Station, E. Tenn. Nov 16, 1863.” (Lenoir Station was a community that built up around the railroad depot of that name, built in 1855. The Lenoirs were ardent Confederates. On 20 Jun 1863 a Union scouting expedition burned the depot as well as the Lenoirs’ sawmill and flour mill. The November action, when James was captured, may have involved another attempt to sabotage the railroad.)



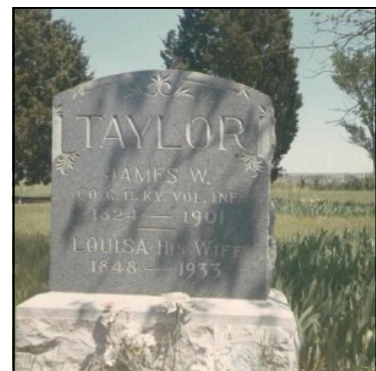

Taylor House in 1977

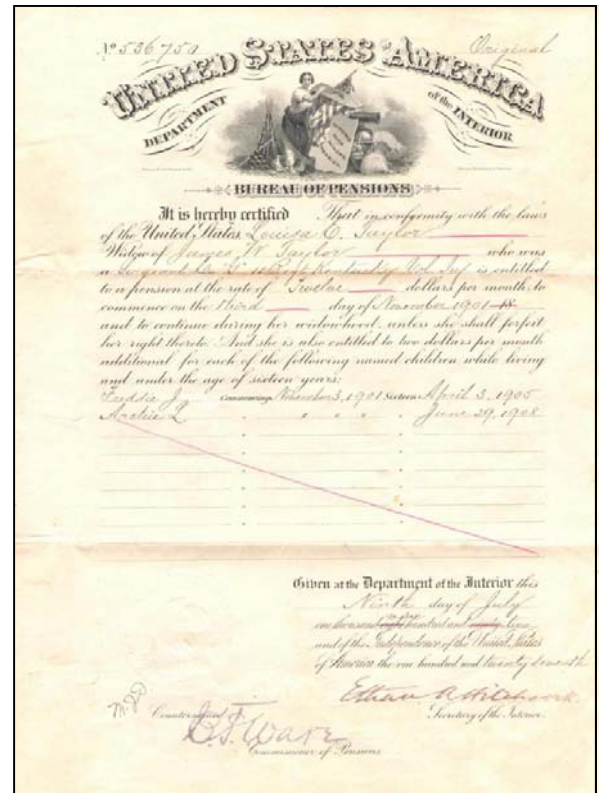


James Wesley Taylor’s grave

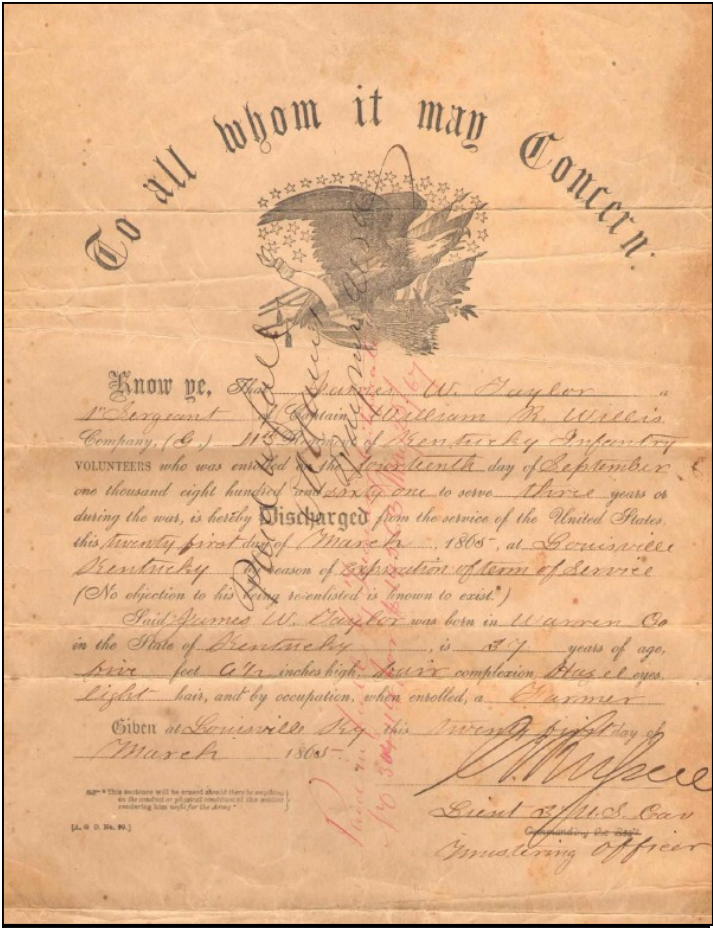
This same MIA statement repeats on the cards until the card for Sept & Oct of 1864, which states "Captured & Prisoner of War since Nov 16 '63." The following card states that a bounty of \$100 is due him. Apparently this was not paid to anyone in 1864, as the Muster-out card says he was mustered out in Louisville, KY Mar 21, 1865 and was last paid to Aug 31, 1863 and Bounty due was still \$100. Remarks state "Was prisoner of war at time his Compy was Md. Out. Captured at Lenoir's Station Ten Nov 16 '63 Soldier has drawn clothing at Annapolis Md on Mch 65 to amt. of \$39.80. The record of this mans co. was capt'd by the enemy in the vicinity of Pulaski Tenn as shown by affidavit attached to Muster-Out Roll in my Possession." The card is signed "Avery" as copyist. There is also a Prisoner of War Record that will take some study to transcribe.

A lot more can be found on the web by Googling for information about the prison camps. Libby Prison in Richmond was a place where officers were kept and a way-station for prisoners being sent elsewhere. Andersonville (famous for its bad conditions) broke James' health permanently.

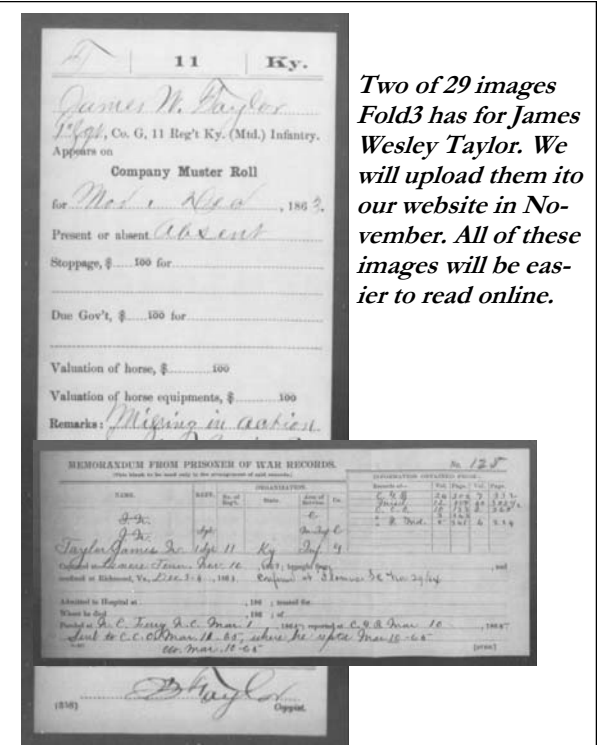

Keeping Taylor Lands in the Family

Terry Young, a Taylor cousin with three Taylor links, has purchased another 120 acres of Joseph Taylor Jr.'s original land in Warren County, KY. Terry is a farmer and a magistrate in the Richardsville area of Warren County. He had previously purchased 90 acres of Joseph Taylor Jr.'s land from the descendants of Alfred Elmo Taylor, who was a son of Taylor cousins Robert Benjamin Franklin Taylor and Sarah Ann Goode. (Robert B.F. Taylor was a son of Allen Taylor and Lavina Cherry, and Sarah Ann Goode was a daughter of Elizabeth Ann Taylor and Samuel Venable Goode.)

The 120 acres he purchased most recently include the old Taylor cemetery where Joseph Taylor Jr. and Sarah Best are buried, along with a lot of other Taylor relatives. He will use some of his newly purchased land for crops and will raise beef cattle on part of the land. And he will guard the cemetery, which is a huge relief to this writer.

John Danielson (a double cousin through Rob Taylor and Sarah Ann Goode) has been researching the earliest land records, trying to find how much land Joseph bought and when. And Terry and his son have been down in the courthouse basement, too, trying to find the original deeds.

Before he died Joseph Taylor Jr. clearly stated in his will that he wanted each of his three sons (William, Allen and Joseph Best) to equally divide his land after their mother died. He specified that each son should receive 92 acres, which would indicate that he had 276 acres at that time.

... my land I leave to my three sons
after my wife's death each to have ninety two acres my son
William Taylor to have his part the west side of said land
my son Allen Taylor to have his part on the east side of
said of said land and my son Joseph Taylor is to have his part
between the other two parts before named also

This says "... my land I leave to my three sons after my wife's death each to have ninety two acres my son William Taylor to have his part the west side of said land my son Allen Taylor to have his part on the east side of said land and my son Joseph Taylor is to have his part in the middle between the other two parts before named...."

Terry now owns 210 of the 276 acres. Good luck to Terry and to John in their research.

Terry is related through William B. Cherry/Frances Taylor (two ways) and William Lawson White/Charlotte Taylor (one way). His wife Linda Hazel is also a descendant of William B. Cherry and Frances Taylor. I can't think of anyone better to be the current steward of this land! ☺

Researching Land Records

Do you know where your great-grandparents lived and what land they owned? How about their parents? You can find some interesting places to visit on your next vacation, or find some stories by visiting families living nearby.

Now that we have the Internet, it's not so difficult to find records if you know where to look online.

There are many tutorials for you to read or watch if you're new to this research. Just Google some phrase such as *genealogy land records information* and you'll find a list. You can also find good reference books for land research with old maps at a Family History Center that has a book collection. The volunteers there can help you as well.

We are hoping to collect many Taylor landmarks this coming year so that we can create tour maps for you. We would also like to know if your family branch still owns historical property, such as in the case of Terry Young, above. ☺

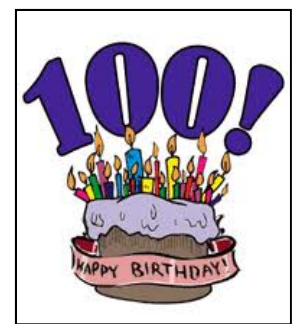
